Community Training

Seventy-five community members participated in LEAD's new community learning sessions throughout 2022. Participants learned about Illinois Department of Commerce & Economic Opportunity's Business Assistance Programs, Cyber Security, Reversing the Exodus, Defy Ventures and Succession Planning for Businesses, Farms, and Nonprofits.

In September 2022, LEAD obtained a \$2,000 grant from Community Foundation Land of Lincoln to continue the program through 2023.

Grant and Loan Assistance

LEAD works with Lincoln businesses as they navigate state and federal grant and loan programs. In 2022, LEAD helped Lincoln businesses obtain \$617,410 in loans and grants.

State Program Implementation

The Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity offers their Advantage Illinois Program to assist small businesses. Working through approved local banks, the program provides subordinated debt at a low, fixed rate. The blended rate is offered to the customer allowing them to access more cost-effective capital. LEAD worked with two local banks to get approved for the program and assist local businesses.

Community Meetings

Throughout 2022, LEAD met with local groups to spread awareness of our services. Presentations were made to Lincoln's KI Business Group, Small Business Coalition, and Noon Kiwanis. Additionally, LEAD regularly participates with Logan County Professionals Network and Downtown Lincoln Businesses to organize collaborative efforts.

NextSite Partnership

In August 2022, LEAD engaged the services of NextSite to market Lincoln's Westside to national and regional retailers and restaurants. Ameren Illinois partnered with NextSite for attraction services and generously underwrites part of the cost, making their services affordable for rural Illinois communities.
